On June 4th, at three in the afternoon, a big bus full of buzzing young people pulled out of the office, headed to Word Of Life camp! This five-night camp was our last full week of Kinship class 2024, bringing our five months together to an end in the most fun way possible. We enjoyed five days of fellowship, fun, Bible teaching, prayer, and three solid meals a day! Leaving behind the hustle and bustle of Kibera, we all enjoyed the tranquility of grass, trees, and open spaces at camp. It gave our students a chance to step away from the stresses of daily life and enjoy calm and relaxation in a different environment.

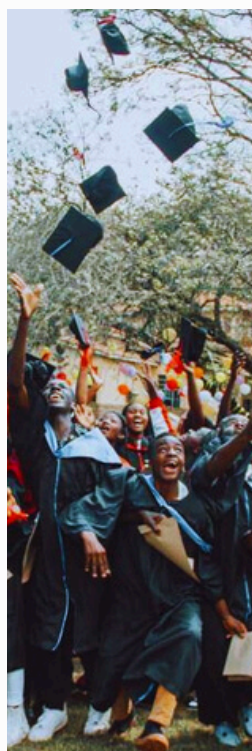
The theme for our time together was **ROOTED** from Colossians 2:6-9. As staff, this is our prayer for these young people as they move forward into their adult lives, that they would be rooted and built up in Christ.

Every morning was spent in Bible study and lessons. We divided up the verses and took a deep dive into the truths presented in them. While Bible teaching may not always be perceived as the most exciting way to spend a morning, all of the Endless staff share the deep conviction that it is the most important thing we can give to them or share with them.

After lessons, Niko led them in group games. There is nothing like game time for young people—the energy and competition are always on another level! Kinship students who had sat quietly in class for half the year suddenly showed another side of their personalities. The highlight of our game time was probably the final day when they were divided into boys and girls. Even the staff and children got involved. After two hours of dancing, smack-talking, slip-sliding, and playing, everyone trailed slowly off for lunch, having given their all to help their team!

Afternoons and evenings were times for more rest and various other activities. We enjoyed sessions of worship, discussion, cake decorating, a concert, and a formal dinner, to name a few.

Saturday, we had the graduation. Every student wore a gown and marched into our little gathering beneath the trees and balloons for our final benediction and presentation of their certificates. We had a time for the graduates to share their testimonies, and it was moving to hear what they had learned over the past five months. Several students expressed gratitude for the opportunity to make lasting friendships and gain the confidence to speak in front of people. Others shared their appreciation for the fun baking and computer lessons where they learned new concepts and, in some cases, earned money with a newfound skill! Many were grateful to the teachers who had given time to disciple and mentor them.

Since moving to Kadongo a few years ago, God has blessed many young people in the village through John and Chami and Endless supporters in the US. There are feeding programs, Bible studies, school ministry, and school fee assistance that have touched the lives of so many. With the help of some family members and a few local volunteers, the Oyoo family faithfully serves, listens, and helps as they are able.

Over the past year, some young ladies, in particular, have been hugely impacted. Chami began hosting a Bible study for young ladies at their home. Anywhere from 20-40 young ladies come to hear about Jesus and share a snack together. Over the past several months, as they have discovered a place where they are valued and loved, some of them have begun to share their stories.

Some of the most severe cases, Chami has been able to share with the Cornerstone church family in Indiana. They have answered the call, and a handful of these young teenage girls are now fully sponsored in boarding school, thanks to their giving. Many of us with children shudder at the thought of sending our young teenagers away for the majority of the year to a boarding school, but I cannot emphasize enough what a tremendous blessing it is for these young ladies to be away from their environments in a safe place, receiving an education! Praise God that He has provided for them, and we pray that they come to see just how much He loves them!
